Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures

The Governing Board recognizes that the district is responsible for complying with applicable state and federal laws and regulations governing educational programs.

The district shall follow the Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures when addressing complaints alleging violation of the Williams legislation outlined in Education Code 35186. The district shall investigate and resolve complaints regarding textbooks and instructional materials, teacher vacancy or misassignment, facilities, including conditions of restrooms, and high school exit examination intensive instruction and services.

The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints at the site level whenever possible.

The Board acknowledges and respects every individual's right to privacy. Williams complaints shall be investigated in a manner that protects the confidentiality of the parties and the facts. This includes keeping the identity of the complainant confidential except to the extent necessary to carry out the investigation or proceedings, as determined by the Superintendent or designee on a case-by-case basis. Complaints may be filed anonymously.

The Board prohibits retaliation in any form for participating in complaint procedures, including but not limited to the filing of a complaint or the reporting of Williams violations. Such participation shall not in any way affect the status, grades or work assignments of the complainant.

The principal or Superintendent or designee shall make all reasonable efforts to investigate any problem within his/her authority and shall remedy a valid complaint within a reasonable period of time not to exceed 30 working days from the date the complaint was received.

If a complainant is not satisfied with the resolution of the complaint, he/she has the right to describe the complaint to the Governing Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting. For any complaint that concerns a facilities condition that poses an emergency or urgent threat to the health and safety of the staff or students, a complainant who is not satisfied with the resolution proffered by the principal or Superintendent or designee may file an appeal to the Superintendent of Public Instruction within 15 days of receiving the district's response.

Williams Uniform Complaint Procedures (continued)

The Superintendent or designee shall report summarized data on the nature and resolution of all complaints on a quarterly basis to the county superintendent of schools and the Board of Trustees. These summaries will be publicly reported at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Board of Trustees.
