



# Huntington Beach Union High School District Board Policies and Administrative Regulations

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## Business and Non-Instructional Operations

### Competitive Food Sales on Campus by Student Organizations and Adult Organizations

The California State Department of Education, Office of Child Nutrition Services, requires that the District establish local policies in addition to State and Federal policies governing the sale of food items on campus by student organizations and adult organizations.

The schools of the Huntington Beach Union High School District, in compliance with State of California regulations, authorize the sale of food items on school premises during the regular school day through the Associated Student Body Organizations provided that:

- 1) no more than one student organization each day shall be approved by the Governing Board to sell no more than three types of food or beverage items such as confections, popcorn, nuts, fruits, or soft drinks,
- 2) food for sale is not prepared on the premises,
- 3) foods or beverages sold by the organization are not the same as those sold in the food service program.
- 4) One or more student organizations per site may conduct up to four food sales of any food items during a school year. Such sales shall be held on the same four days for all organizations at a school site.

Any organization selling foods must adhere to the Orange County Health and Welfare requirements.

All income from the sale of foods/beverages must accrue to the nonprofit food service or the nonprofit accounts of student organizations approved by the school.
