Instruction

Criteria for Evaluation of Consolidated Programs

The Superintendent or designee shall conduct annual evaluations to determine whether supplemental services provided by consolidated programs are effective and supportive of the core curriculum. As a basis for this evaluation, the Superintendent or designee shall recommend specific, measurable criteria to be used at each school and at the district level to evaluate student achievement and the effectiveness of each consolidated program. The following criteria shall be used:

- The programs contribute to the accomplishment of specific program goals and objectives.
- The programs have improved student reading, writing, mathematics and speaking skills at all levels.
- The programs have improved student performance in core curricular areas as addressed in the school plan.
- The programs have improved the curriculum and instructional methodologies.
- The programs support a coordinated curriculum, academically focused, with rigorous content.
- The programs have enhanced the school's effectiveness in areas identified in the school plan.

The Superintendent or designee shall submit explicit and measurable criteria for consideration by the Board as part of the Local Improvement Plan. If desired, each school may establish additional evaluation criteria beyond these districtwide criteria.

Data collected in this evaluation process shall be presented to School Site Councils and other appropriate advisory committees for consideration during the process of annual school plan reviews and revisions. Evaluations conducted for each school shall be presented annually to the Board.
